FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

We had a very successful Stewardship Campaign and thank you to all for your continuing support. We received 113 pledges for a total of \$308,500. This represents an increase of \$46,500 over last year's pledges. The 2015 budget was approved at the Church Council's January 20, 2015, meeting. Estimated income in 2015 is \$544,530 and estimated expenses are \$539,800, which reflects a slight surplus for 2015.

TO REFLECT UPON THIS LENTEN SEASON

FOUR HAMLINE YOUTH PARTICIPATE IN INTERFAITH

This past President's Day, Jack Molter, Dorothy Hendrickson, Amanda Bluem, and Martha Young participated in the Saint Paul Area Council of Church's Interfaith Youth Day of Service. This was a day long event where Hamline Youth were able to participate in workshops on other faiths, complete service work, and meet teenagers of other faiths.

We had a spectacular time. As a part of the day, students can choose workshops to attend on faith, leadership, and service, and they are assigned service projects in the afternoon. Our four confirmation students chose to do workshops on Judaism and Buddhist Meditation, and were able to meet and chat with



another youth group from an Islamic Center in Brooklyn Park. The keynote speaker was a well known Minneapolis Hip Hop Artist, Brother Ali, and our four confirmands helped with communications at a relief organization, and helped clean up the facilities at a day shelter for homeless families.



Opportunities like this are a very important way that we live out our faith at Hamline Church. Our Christian faith calls us to serve others, and to live in honest relationship with our neighbors. Part of living in that honest relationship is by being a dedicated member of the wider community of faith in our city of Minneapolis/Saint Paul. And now, our city is a city of many, many faiths.

In a time when we are constantly bombarded by religiously motivated violence, all throughout the world, coming together to serve others helps us to break down the rifts between us. Service activities allow people the opportunity to connect and talk over a common purpose.

All our faiths call us to work for the betterment of the world. When we stand together, many faiths and one common purpose, we combat the disconnection and hatred that fuel the violence we so often hear about. We protest the murder of three Muslim college students in North Carolina. We protest the violent terrorism taken on in desperation across the world. We protest the hate that keeps us apart, and we fulfill the call to love our neighbors as ourselves.

Christians in our day and age have a call: a call to work alongside people of other faiths in honest service and authentic understanding. The four youth that participated in the Interfaith Youth Day of Service scrubbed kitchen counters alongside Muslim senior high school students, stuffed envelopes together with youth leaders from Jewish congregations, and ate alongside new friends of other faiths, and in these actions they took on that call. Next time you see them, tell them thanks—and maybe ask them about their experience.

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CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATE

SUMMARY OF THE JANUARY 20, 2015 CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

- 1. **Co-Chair Anne Thompson convened the Church Council meeting.** Pastor Mariah gave an opening prayer.
- 2. A few committee reports were received. The minutes of the November 18, 2014 Church Council meeting were approved.
- 3. Pastor Mariah presented a Staff Update which detailed her upcoming 13-week maternity leave and Rev. Mary Keen providing pulpit supply and other services during this period. The Annual Conference will cover Pastor Mariah's replacement during the leave.
- 4. Mark Krueger (Finance committee) presented the 2015 Church operating budget. Income was projected at \$544,530 and vs. expenses of \$539,797. Coupled with the 2015 operating budget are the recommendations from the Paulson Bequest Task force for distribution of the \$184,529 bequest to HCUM, with \$25,000 (\$15,000 to fund Children and Youth Ministry positions and \$10,000 to bridge the 2014 deficit) toward the 2015 budget. Appreciation was expressed to the members of the Bequest Task Force (Heidi Brezinka, Peter Theisen, Diane Krueger, Amy Schroeder Ireland, and Pastor Mariah) for their efforts in a very busy time period and to Harry Paulson for his generosity and thoughtfulness. A question was raised whether the recommendations met the criteria established at the November Council meeting. One criterion stipulated "Able to leverage savings and investment." Mariah spoke to the 3R (Reach, Renew, Rejoice) plan for Congregational Development of the Minnesota Annual Conference. Churches are asked to make a 'tithe' of their annual budget over a five-year period. A Paulson Bequest recommendation is to use \$20,000 for a 3R Conference Capital Campaign—this would be a matching drive, with congregants being asked to match that amount through pledges over the five year period. Thus HCUM would be contributing \$40,000 to aid the Conference in establishing new churches and revitalizing others (including our own). Signage improvements outside the church--a new lighted one on Minnehaha, and possibly updates on the one on Englewood are also included in the recommendations (at \$15,000).

A motion was made that Church Council approve the Harry Paulson Bequest Task Force Recommendations as presented in the January, 2015 report, along with the recommendation that biannual reports should be made to Council, which will redirect any unspent funds. After seconding, the motion passed unanimously. A motion was made, seconded, and passed that the Council approve the Task Force recommendation that \$20,000 be available to match individual pledges made by HCUM members during a February, 2015 pledge drive.

A motion was made that the 2015 HCUM operating budget be approved as presented by the Finance committee. After seconding, the motion passed by voice vote. Appreciation was expressed to the members of the Finance committee.

- 5. Co-Chair Amy Schultz spoke about the September 27 visit by Bishop Ough, which coincides with the 135th Anniversary of Hamline University and the former Hamline Methodist Episcopal Church. HU personnel are working jointly in the Celebration planning. The new bread oven should be available at that time, and could play a role in the annual "welcome back" for HU students. A joint work-day between HU and HCUM was proposed. A Task Force involving representatives of Worship, Missions/Social Justice, and other relevant committees was proposed along with a theme of "Celebration: Past and Future."
- **6.** Pastor Mariah gave an update on the tensions between Hamline University's expansion plan and the desire of some residents of Hamline Village to preserve historic homes. City Councilman Russ Stark is working with the MN Office for Collaboration and Dispute Resolution to facilitate a collaborative problem solving process. HCUM space has been offered and we are an invited party in the assessment phase.

...CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATE

- 7. A preview of the Communication meeting to be held on January 27 was given. A Skype Dialogue will take place with Rev. Cameron Trimble of the Center for Progressive Renewal and persons interested in communications.
- 8. The Trustees are reviewing all external groups using the church, in an effort to standardize needs, setup and security issues, and charges. Hamline University's historic usage of the church is also part of this review.
- 9. The meeting adjourned with Anne Thompson giving a closing prayer.
