Hamline Church Council Statement regarding the recent actions of the General Conference of the United Methodist Church in St. Louis

The Hamline Church Council hereby denounces the decision of the 2019 General Conference of the United Methodist Church to deny full inclusion to people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, queer, intersex, or asexual (LGBTQIA). The adoption of the so-called "Traditional Plan" - which calls not only for the exclusion of our LGBTQIA siblings in Christ through ordination and marriage, but also for the defrocking of church leaders who actively include our LGBTQIA siblings - is hurtful, shameful, and a contradiction of our values as a Christian congregation.

Hamline Church has been a reconciling congregation for over 20 years. In this role, our church has outwardly professed and practiced our belief that our LGBTQIA siblings are equal members of our church community in every way, while planning praying, and waiting for the day when the United Methodist church would fully open its doors to all people. With the passing of the Traditional Plan, those doors have all but closed.

As the governing body of Hamline Church, we will:

- Ensure that Hamline Church remains a home for all of God's people in all ways, with no exceptions
- Proclaim and celebrate the sacred worth of all of God's children
- Be leaders in the movement to devise a path forward that is grounded in love and dedicated to full inclusion
- Seek to undo the harm caused by exclusion and discrimination through systemic forms of oppression against all marginalized people both inside the church and in greater society
- Recommit to working for the full inclusion of all people

While the path forward is not yet clear, we reaffirm our commitment to a future in which all individuals, regardless of orientation or identity, are fully included in every aspect of the life of the church.
